

Four Year and Two Year Scholarship Awards

The Foundation also contributes \$3 million annually to students entering college in its "Four-Year Award for Seniors" program and another \$400,000 in its "Coca-Cola Two-Year Colleges Scholarship" program. Coca Cola Scholars must commit to a lifetime of community leadership and service upon receipt of their coke scholarship. Perhaps things really do go better with Coke!

Merit Based - The coca cola scholarships are merit based scholarships, and no, you do not have to be a coke drinker to qualify! The foundation focuses on students who have demonstrated leadership skills and participation in their communities through volunteering as well those who have excelled academically.

Application Due Date - Interested applicants must apply during their senior year in high school.

Applications for 2015 are now closed. Applications for 2016 are accepted from August 1 - October 31 2015.

Coca Cola Scholarship Requirements - The program is open to all high school seniors, whether home schooled or in a traditional school, in the United States who are U.S. citizens or legalized residents. They must meet the minimum GPA requirement (see below), and they cannot be children or grandchildren of Coca Cola employees. More detailed requirements can be found below.

Coca Cola First Generation Scholarship

Are you the first in your family to attend a college or university? The Coca-Cola First Generation Scholarship program has awarded more than \$19 million in scholarships to support students who are the first in their immediate families to go to college. The program has reached more than 1,000 students at approximately 400 U.S. colleges and universities.

Interested students should contact the school they are planning to attend to ask whether a Coca Cola First Generation Scholarship is in place, and if so, for the application.

Coca Cola Scholars Program (for 4-year College Applicants)

Coca Cola Scholars - This scholarship program is for those high school seniors who will be attending a 4-year college or university. The Coca-Cola Scholars Program awards 250 four-year achievement-based scholarships each year.

Coke Scholarship Semifinalists - From the original applicants, the scholarship committee will choose approximately 2,200 semifinalists. These semifinalists will submit a secondary application, and from this group the 250 finalists will be chosen.

Coke Scholarship Finalists - In April of their senior year, the 250 Finalists are invited to Atlanta for personal interviews. The Finalists are interviewed by a National Selection Committee representing outstanding leaders in business, government, education and the arts. 50 students are then designated as National Scholars and will each receive a \$20,000 award for their college or university. The remaining 200 students are designated as Regional Scholars and will each receive a \$10,000 award for their college or university education.

Information about the interview is sent with the letter telling the student they are a finalist.

Coca Cola Scholarship Eligibility Requirements

Interested applicants must be: ÉCurrent high school (or home-schooled) seniors in the United States. É U.S. Citizens; U.S. Nationals; U.S. Permanent Residents; Temporary Residents (in a legalization program); Refugees; Asylees; Cuban-Haitian Entrants; or Humanitarian Parolees. ÉAnticipating completion of high school diploma at the time of application. ÉPlanning to pursue a degree at an accredited U.S. college or university ÉHave a minimum 3.00 GPA at the end of their junior year of high school. ÉChildren or grandchildren of employees, officers or owners of Coca Cola bottling companies, The Coca Cola Company, Company divisions or subsidiaries are not eligible.

Academic Team Program**

For students who attend or plan to attend two year colleges and earn a two year degree, there are 400 Coca Cola scholarships available.

The top scoring student in each of the fifty states will be named a New Century Scholar and will each receive a \$2,000 scholarship for college. Additionally, the remaining 350 students will be named Gold Scholars, receiving a \$1,500 scholarship, or Silver Scholars, receiving a \$1,250 scholarship, or Bronze Scholars receiving a \$1,000 scholarship. A state may have multiple Gold, Silver, or Bronze Scholars, making this one of the best community college scholarship programs. All scholars will also receive special medallions.

Eligibility Requirements**

It is the responsibility of the financial aid department at the college to nominate applicants, but students can let the office know if they are interested in a nomination.

To be eligible for a nomination, students should have a minimum GPA of 2.5, be a U.S. citizen, have verification from the school that they have volunteered within the past twelve months, and plan to take at least two courses the following semester.

To be eligible for these programs, students must submit an application for the All-USA Community College Academic Team/Coca-Cola Community College Academic Team.

Pepsi Cola Scholarship Program

Pepsi Cola international offers many scholarship programs worldwide to help college students with rising tuition costs and expenses. Following is a summary of the Pepsi scholarships that are awarded to the students in the U.S.

\$10,000 Renewable Scholarship - A division of Pepsi, known as the Eastern Division of QTG, offers a renewable scholarship of \$10,000 to eligible students. The students who apply must have a GPA of 3.0 or above and demonstrate a financial need. The students should also demonstrate good leadership qualities and participation in extracurricular activities. This scholarship is limited to those eligible students who are planning to join City College of New York or any of the universities like Howard, Northeastern, Penn State, Saint Joseph's, Binghamton University-SUNY, Temple, Virginia Tech or University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.

\$10,000 Pepsi Scholarships

\$10,000 Pepsi Scholarship - Pepsi Bottling Group offers a \$10,000 Pepsi scholarship program. The applying students must be graduating seniors who have a GPA of 2.5 or above and who are admitted to a Maryland college, university or technical school. The students must be active in community services as well as demonstrating good communication skills.

Pepsi Public Affairs Scholarship

Pepsi Public Affairs Scholarship - Pepsi-Cola public affairs scholarship offers financial assistance to students who have completed at least 45 semester hours at Missouri University with a GPA of 3.25 or above and who can prove their public service skills as well as their leadership skills.

Pepsi Mid-Del Technology Scholarship

Pepsi Mid-Del Technology Scholarship - Pepsi also sponsors a scholarship known as Mid-Del Technology Scholarship. The applicant for this program must be from Mid-Del technology center with a GPA of 3.0 or above who is preparing to join Oklahoma University. The applicant should also prove a financial need in order to receive this scholarship.

Pepsi Frito Lay Scholarship - The Pepsi Service Scholarship and Pepsi/Frito-Lay Scholarship offer scholarships to students from Nebraska. Both scholarships are given out to students with a good GPA and with demonstrated leadership skills and social activities.

Pepsi Scholarship Fund Hospitality High School

PepsiCo Foundation has made a \$250,000 contribution to the American Hotel and Lodging Educational Foundation. Kohls Scholarship Program 2016

Kohl's scholarship is officially called the Kohl's Cares Scholarship Program, and previously was known as KWC or Kohl's Kids Who Care Scholarship Program. It is one of the popular private scholarships for college. Recently over 37,000 applications were received.

Kohls department stores offers this scholarship for students in two age groups: ages 6 ó 12 and ages 13 ó 18 who have not yet graduated from high school, based upon outstanding community service during the last 12 months (e.g. March 2015 - March 2016).

Academic achievement and financial need are not considered.

The scholarship money may be used for 2 year, 4 year college or trade schools. Recipients must enroll in college or trade school within two years after graduation from high school.

Kohls Scholarship Awards

National Winners - \$9,000 for national winners (5 in each age group) plus an additional \$1,000 donation to a charity of the recipients choice

Regional Winners - \$1,000 (over 200 award winners)

McDonalds Scholarship

In addition to the McDonald's National Employees Scholarship, RMHC offers four distinct types of McDonalds scholarships to the public:

Writing a Personal Essay

There are numerous individuals or firms who provide college coaching to help students get into competitive colleges and universities for a hefty fee. As such, they offer guidance or assistance with their students' essays.

But! Do not panic! Most high schools (public or private) have a designated teacher, usually an English language teacher, who has assumed the responsibility of helping the seniors with their college essays. Find out who that *kind* teacher is. He / She is often the best resource to help you with your essays. Thank them in advance because they do not get paid for taking up this extra responsibility, and let them know early on that you want them to critique your writing.

While there is no specific formula for success, following are some strategies to help you get started writing a personal essay:

Writing a successful college application essay is a lengthy process. It requires much writing, re-writing, and frequent editing. Start this process in August or September of your senior year.

Start a Word document and do as much pre-writing as possible. Write about moments of your life, or instances when you have been very proud, very frightened, very sad, very happy, etc. You can later use these moments to construct your personal essay.

Your pre-writing should also include anything that is happening with you or around you at the time. This will be a collection of random writings that can serve you as a foundation reflecting -who you are or how you see and perceive the world around you.

Choose 3-5 people who know you well such as friends, family, neighbors, etc. and ask them to provide you with a notable moment, a story or an experience that they feel describes you or your character. You can use this feedback to construct your personal essay as well.

After you write your personal statement essay, give it to someone who doesn't know you and ask that person to read it and give you his/ her opinion using only three adjectives. If the adjectives are like-arrogant, self-absorbed, and ignorant, then it is time to go back and write another essay!

Do not use fancy vocabulary words. Instead, use the vocabulary that you are most comfortable with.

Take out the fluff! That means do not make a statement about your character such as "I am driven, intelligent, and hard-working". Instead, your essay must reflect or convey these qualities such that the reader would come up to this conclusion without you saying so directly in your personal statement essay.

Your first sentence should have a hook! Something catchy to get the reader hooked and compelled to read the rest of your personal essay. We have some great college essay examples at the bottom of the page.

Be honest with yourself. Do not create a façade behind which you have to hide. Do not create a false image of yourself to just please a particular school because you will most likely find that that school is not the right match for you anyhow.

Do not use Drama to make your reader feel sorry for you. It doesn't work!

Pay attention to your spelling, grammar, and punctuation. No one wants to read a personal statement essay with mistakes.

Make sure that your essay correctly addresses the right school. There is nothing worse than submitting your essay for college X to college Y. Make sure you edit and correct all specific college references accordingly.

Finally, writing an outstanding personal essay takes time and perseverance. As tempting as it might be, no one can write your personal statement essay for you better than you can. It is your story after all. Furthermore, the admission committee members are highly trained and knowledgeable professionals who read thousands upon thousands of applications and essays. As such, they are able to detect even the slightest differences between your writing style and vocabulary in one section of your application verses another. Once they suspect the authenticity or originality of your essay, they will almost always disqualify you.

Federal Financial Aid to Study Abroad

Looking for scholarships to study abroad? Federal financial aid is available to qualified U.S. students who are interested in studying abroad for a semester, a year, or even a full undergraduate or graduate degree program outside the United States. Depending on the type of program you are choosing, there are two different federal financial aid programs available.

Study Abroad Scholarships and Financial Aid Federal Financial Aid for a Semester or a Year

This is commonly called the **study-abroad** program and is administered through your current American college or university. To qualify for federal financial aid, you must file your [FAFSA](#) and meet the FAFSA eligibility criteria. Contact your school's financial aid office to find out which type of federal aid you will be eligible to receive for your study-abroad program. This process is lengthy because there is much paperwork that needs to be done by both your current school in the U.S. and your chosen international school. Therefore, you should start the process as early as possible.

Your school can also help you decide which international universities and colleges offer the courses that will be counted as credits for your major, and can advise you on any additional scholarships to study abroad. If you received any institutional scholarships from your college or university, those may qualify for study abroad scholarships too.

Federal Financial Aid for a Full Degree Program

Currently, there are over 800 different institutions of higher learning in over 40 different countries and regions of the world who participate in the federal student aid program including:

Argentina, Australia, Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Canada, China, Costa Rica, Czech Republic, Denmark, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Egypt, England, Finland, France, Germany, Grenada, Hong Kong, Hungary, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, Lebanon, Mexico, New Zealand, Northern Ireland, Norway,

Philippines, Poland, Russia, Scotland, South Africa, Spain, St. Kitts-Nevis, St. Maarten, Sweden, Switzerland, Thailand, the Netherlands, and Wales.

The federal financial aid for those students, who want to get their entire undergraduate education at these international schools, is limited to the federal student loans (a Direct Subsidized loan or a Direct Unsubsidized loan) because these schools are not participating in the U.S. Department of Education Grant programs. You must file your FAFSA to be considered for the federal student loans.
