T.F. North introduces weapons detection system
New safety measure runs smoothly during first week of school

For the first time in Thornton Fractional North's history, District 215 has installed a weapons detection system. The system has students take out any electronic devices they have in their bags and hand them to a staff member before passing through the system. If the system goes off, students will have their bags searched. "It was a district decision. It has already been in the works for quite some time...schools across the suburbs have had these systems before. This definitely adds a layer of security," said Assistant Principal of Building Control, Mr. Humphrey. The weapons detection system hit many students in different ways. There were a lot of different opinions. For example, many freshmen think it's reasonable to have the new system. "[It] makes the school more secure," said freshman Lymari Vargas. Others feel weird to have to go through and have their bag searched simply because the metal in their binder caused the machine to go off. Many upperclassmen who have gone all of their high school years without the new system feel more upset about it. "I think the metal detectors are very useful for protecting the students, but I think they're a little unnecessary. I can see why it's useful," said

junior Malik Hill. "At first I didn't like the new system because they took forever to go through and they were too much, but they've settled down. It's a good thing now that the school has a safer feeling," added junior Stacayla Martin. Although students have mixed feelings about the new weapons detection system, many deans' assistants have expressed their approval of it. "It serves its purpose to protect the students. We can't just think that it won't happen to us because it can happen to anybody," said Ms. Hunter. "At the end of the day, it's just keeping the children safe. So that's what's most important for us," added Mr. Moore. Despite the hassle, students should understand that the new weapons detection system is another step taken by the administration to ensure the security of the school. "At the end of the day, we want it to be safer...you want to have multiple layers of security to make sure that everybody in the school is safe," said Humphrey. The principal, Mr. Rucinski, believes that the new procedure is going well, "By the second [and] third day, there's really no lines...It does add a layer of security, so I've been very happy with it."

T.F. North football field & track construction update

The football field is still being converted from grass to turf. Many concerned students are wondering if the field will be done for the upcoming football season. According to the District 215 Director of Facilities, Mr. Tim Stephan, the field is scheduled to debut by the Homecoming game on October 10th. Students can expect the new football field to have a dark and light green turf with a new track around it that will include eight lanes

instead of the current six. The pole vault and high jump areas will also be upgraded. “Going to an eight-lane track will give us more availability to host meets and do different things of that nature,” said Athletic Director Stubbs. “The track is going to be gray which will be pretty cool, and it will have an updated high jump, long jump, and shot put [area] for all of those field events for track and field,” said Principal Rucinski.

Many faculty members are excited about this new big change. “This will be a huge upgrade for not only football, but other sports and our PE program as well. We hope the new field will also allow us to connect better with local youth programs. This will put us on a ‘level playing field’ with neighboring schools who have had turf for some time now,” said Head Football Coach Anthony Pignatiello.




